

# Indigenous Immersion

Term 2 – Week 7 Tuesday 4th June 2019

A vital component of the Steiner curriculum is its focus on the cultural epochs during the second seven-year developmental phase, between the ages of approximately seven to fourteen. Throughout this time, our students experience an imaginative picture of many of the major cultures that have shaped the world. These impressions are initially delivered through mythological, fairy tale and dreamtime story, and as the child develops, they experience each culture through song, music, food, craft, language, dance and more.

Human endeavour is a powerful learning tool for our students who are preparing to take their own place in the world. As the children enter the middle school years, they are faced with deep and sometimes challenging pictures of humanity arising out of their studies of the Roman Empire, the Crusades, the Spanish conquest of South America, the Chinese, American and French Revolutions and the World Wars.

Class 10 are in the midst of one of the most significant learning experiences we offer at our school – the Community Experience camp in Central Australia. This is an opportunity for our students to directly experience a culture that, at well over 50 000 years old, is unimaginably ancient in comparison to all the others they have come across in their previous years of schooling.

While they have certainly heard the dreamtime stories before and learned the history of Cook and the settlement of Australia, this is the first time that our students gain a direct experience of being immersed in the current reality of the life of indigenous Australians. It is an enormously rich and sometimes emotional experience for our young people, guided carefully and thoughtfully by the staff who accompany them on this journey.

In the weeks that follow, parents and teachers of these students always report that they have returned somehow changed – more compassionate, wiser, more aware of the world and the people who share it with them, and just a little closer to becoming all that they were born to be.

Using our own Merino Sheep's wool, shorn in the first term, she made a skein of wool ready to be washed and botanically dyed. Flo shared her years of experience with spinning wool with the class, who had many questions that she very generously answered.





The Back to Earth Initiative is run by the Metropolitan Waste and Resource Recovery Group (MWRRG) in partnership with 26 Victorian Councils, to support the successful operation of green waste and organics processing facilities.

We have applied for a grant to support sustainable land management practices and education by extending our compost and worm farming system into the upper school and establishing gardens around the Class 7 and 8 area.

Funding will purchase an insulated double chambered compost tumbler, metal buckets and additional compost bins for the upper school, and soil, seedlings and timber for Class 7 and 8 garden beds.
