The result of much rich discussion in Management, College and Faculties over the last two years has been to follow our traditional performance of Bach's Passion of St John at the end of the first term by an Autumn festival at the beginning of the second term.

This year, we will maintain this form and structure, but put some further work into continuing to develop an Autumn festival that meets our students across the school. Our festival committee is hard at work and we are very excited by the possibility of what we may create together with Classes 1 to 12 working together.





NEW PRESCHOOL BUILDING

We have received the latest plans for our new Preschool building from the architects and are very excited in anticipation of starting to build soon. You may have noticed some site preparation happening on the far side of the Briar Rose room already, and we expect to begin building in March.

GARDENING IN CLASS 3

Term 1 has been a busy time in the garden for Class 3. We have had fun with a variety of activities including chicken care, composting and weeding.

We started clearing the Class 3 garden of the many weeds that had grown over the summer break - our Class 3 chickens were delighted to receive a snack of grass and greens. Our chickens are very important for a variety of reasons; they give us eggs, eat our scraps, provide us with manure for the garden, and are wonderful companions. We learned how to take care of them properly and make sure our girls are happy.

Soil is very important for growing food. We explored composting through a variety of methods including worm farming, biodynamic methods as well as creating pest-proof compost for our classroom's scraps. We took our wheelbarrows down to the paddock and collected cow manure and comfrey leaves, which, once broken down in our biodynamic compost, will make excellent soil for our plants to grow.







GARDENING WITH CLASS 7

On Tuesday last week, ten Class 7 students prepared a patch of the circular garden bed ready for planting potatoes. We were greeted by a friendly blue tongue lizard and a frog which relocated themselves before we got to work.

We started by breaking up the soil with mattocks and creating mounds of soil in which the potatoes will be planted. We then mixed in a wheelbarrow load of worm castings to each mound to increase the fertility of the soil and help the potatoes thrive. We just managed to cover each mound in pea mulch and worm tea before the thunderstorm hit and watered in the mounds for us.

Next week we'll plant the potatoes - we look forward to harvesting them and eating them at the Winter Festival.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school/campus.

The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by private car or on one of the school buses.

To be eligible students must

- attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended
- be of school age (attending Prep to Class 12) and reside in Victoria

Application forms are available from the School office. Previous applications are carried forward providing that all details remain correct. You will only need to fill in a fresh form if your address details have changed or you are adding an extra child to your claim.



2020 Student Residential Address and Other Information collection notice

This notice is from the Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department), to advise you that the department has requested that your child's school provide a 'statement of addresses', in accordance with the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (Cth) (Regulation).

A statement of addresses contains the following information about each student at the school:

- Student residential address (not student names)
- Student level of education (i.e. whether the student is a primary or secondary student)
- Student boarding school status (i.e. whether the student is boarding or a day student)
- Names and residential addresses of students' parent(s) and/or guardian(s)

Schools generate a record number for each student for the purposes of this collection, which is also provided to the department.

Purpose of the collection

This collection is routinely used to inform Commonwealth school education policy, and to help ensure that Commonwealth funding arrangements for non-government schools are based on need, and are fair and transparent.

The information collected in the *statement of addresses* will be used to inform school funding calculations. It is combined with data held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) to calculate the estimated capacity of a school community to contribute to the schools' operating costs (capacity to contribute). Australian Government funding to non-government schools takes this estimated capacity to contribute into account.

On 20 September 2018 the Government announced that it will implement a new, improved capacity to contribute methodology used in the calculation of the Commonwealth's needs-based funding arrangements for non-government schools. Known as the direct measure of income (DMI), the proposed new methodology is based on the median income of parents or guardians of students at a non-government school. This is in contrast to the current area based measure which is a point in time analysis based on average circumstances in 2011 of the area in which students at the school lived. This change follows a review of the existing methodology by the National School Resourcing Board. Use and disclosure of personal information

Your personal information is protected by law, including the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth). Any use and disclosure of your personal information relating to the *statement of addresses* will occur in accordance with the Regulation.

Your personal information may be used by the department, or disclosed to the ABS, for the purposes of reviewing capacity to contribute methodology, calculating capacity to contribute and Commonwealth school education policy development (including school funding), or where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

Your personal information will be provided to the ABS for capacity to contribute calculations and analysis as part of the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Departmental staff will use the ABS' secure DataLab to undertake analysis and calculate capacity to contribute scores for schools using de-identified data (i.e. data that has had identifiable information such as name and address removed). The department may, from time to time, carry out audits of school submissions. In the event of an audit, contracted auditors may seek to compare a school's *statement of addresses* with student enrolment information held by the school. These contractors will not use the information for any other purpose.

The department may also be required to disclose your personal information to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology (ICT) support services to the department.

What do you need to do?

You are not required to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested details to the department, however, you may wish to ensure that your school has the most up-to-date and correct details for your family.
